

Last Sunday, Bflat, a volunteer-driven orchestra group consisting of high school students who are eager to share Korean cultures through music, performed at Brookdale Assisted Home at Northville.

During a 30-minute long performance, Bflat started by playing old pop music such as Amazing Grace and wrapped up their show with 홀로아리랑 (Holo-Arirang). The roughly 25-30 people big audience group cheered, enjoyed, and appreciated Bflat's performance.
